

## Adolescent Activities List

**Note from Taking the Escalator Author –** I ran adolescent groups and intensive outpatient programs for many years using Taking the Escalator as the primary source and I have had consistently had positive outcomes using these tools. On occasion you may need to modify an activity or at least adapt your approach when using an activity for it to be used effectively with adolescents. For example with a newer less cohesive group it is best to pick more simple and straightforward choices. There are other activities that seem to almost always get a positive reception from teens in group every time. Again, if you make an effort to be creative and engaging you can make a large percentage of the existing Taking the Escalator materials work well with adolescents, however, below is a list of topic areas and a list of specific activities that are field-tested with adolescent groups that should help you get started
